With reference to your letter of the 29th ultimo to the Supt. General of Indian Affairs relative to the land occupied in connection with Mr. O'Leary's saw mill on the Restigouche Indian Reserve, I beg to inform you that the Indian Agent for the locality has been requested to inform this Department of the quantity of land thus occupied, with a view to such steps being taken to obtain a surrender thereof from the Indians as may be necessary in order, should it still be considered advisable to effect a sale or lease of the property to Mr. O'Leary or his assigns, *that the same may be done.* I have the honor to be,
