Sir.

I beg to state that I have been instructed by the Chiefs of the Chippewa Band of the Thames, kindly and respectfully to enquire of your Hon. Dept. of Indian Affairs, <sup>whether</sup> the said Band may expect to realize the settlement in full of the promise made to our Band by the Inspector Mr Ramsey, on the occasion of his last visit to our Reserve in connection with <sup>the</sup> dispute of land between the Chippewa and Murray Bands, of the Caradoc Reserve; which your Department is aware of its long having remained unsettled.

The Mr Inspector Ramsey, induced and advised the said Chippewa Band to accept the sum of Ten thousand Dollars from the Government, as a settlement in full, that, if the terms proposed by him, he would urge the Indian Department, to distribute the sum of Five thousand Dollars to the Chippewas of the Thames out of the said Ten thousand Dollars at an early day, leaving the balance i.e. Five thousand Dollars to be invested with the Capital Funds of said Band
