Advertisements

- no an employee or seeking employment as an employee except pursuant to and in accordance with a written possit obtained from the Selective Service Officer.
- a posmit to advertise under this part, the Selective Service Officer may, in accordance with principles and directions set out in instructions given by the Director,
 - (a) refuse the penuit,
 - (b) grant the permit subject to such conditions as he decas proper, or
 - (c) with the applicant's concent, make such arrangements, at the applicant's expense, as he deems proper.

Compulsory Paployment

- 209. (1) A Selective Service Officer may by order in writing direct any person.
 - (a) to report for interview at a local office at a time which will not interfere with his work or occupation, if any;
 - (b) if the person is unexployed or not gainfully employed to apply forthwith for specified employment which, in the opinion of the Selective Service Officer, is suitable and to accept the employment when it is offered to him; or
