Patton, Francis Landey

Jan. 22, 1843 - Nov. 25, 1932

President of Princeton University 1888-1902

Born at Carberry Hill, Warwick, Bermuda.

Educated at Warwick Academy and a grammar school in
Toronto; later at Knox College and University of
Toronto; graduated from Princeton Theological
Seminary in 1865, and in the same year ordained
to the Presbyterian Ministry.

Held pastorates in New York, Brooklyn and Chicago, and
held various church offices, including moderatorship
of General Assembly of Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)
1878.

1881 returned to Princeton Theological Seminary to become
Professor of the Relations of Philosophy and Science
to the Christian Religion. (Robert L. Stuart Found-
ation).

1888 chosen to follow James McCosh as President of Princeton
(then still called the College of New Jersey)
- continued to lecture in ethics, and to preach in
Chapel.
