Court. Went to pub in Southampton to have a drink - stayed all evening.
Left at 9.30. We each bought our own drinks.

2nd wit] D62307 Cpl Claude Rocheleau. Fins MR duly sworn, states;
Pros. I know accd. Cpl Lagace A. - We were put at Hursley camp on last
day of August. Cpl Lagace, Pte St Georges. I arranged to spend a day
in Southampton. On Sun we went to Southampton, walked
around all afternoon & about 6.45 went to a pub. St Georges was
drunk - after a few drinks accd noticed his money partly spent. When
he took his hand out of his pocket he noticed something
in back pocket. He pulled out a wallet & said "where is that
from". He opened wallet & I noticed it was Grenier's wallet by
his identity card, by picture printed on identity card. Cpl Lagace found
2-10/- notes in wallet & said "that is some more to drink".
There were some papers also, he ate them up one by one. The
Pte St Georges & accd told me "sue if your maulted, you are
not supposed to have seen anything". Left pub about 9.45
to take train. Next morning accd gave Grenier's suit back to
him. Grenier asked "what have you done with my
wallet that was in my pocket". Accd said "I haven't seen
nothing on them". accd had borrowed £6 because from Grenier
Cross-exam In Southampton met some boys in Pub looking for place to
eat - went to canteen, had tea & cakes & then went for bath &
spent about a shilling each. Went to pub around a quarter to
seven. couldn't say how many drunks about 2 or 3. 2 paid my bills
& Cpl Lagace paid his. St Georges was drunk. accd & 2 each paid 2 to 3
drunks each. Don't remember price of beer - ordinary price
