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ing days,

or God, who gives you this day to labour in it, for the salvation of your soul; and consider this day may be your last. When dressed, place yourself in the presence of God, in a respectful posture, on bended knees, and blessing yourself, adore him with the most profound respect; give him thanks for his benefits to you, especially for having watched over you during the Night; and join with all the angels and saints, in blessing and praising his holy name.

Afterwards recollect yourself, if you offended God during the night, and what were the sins you committed the day before; and with an humble and contrite heart, begging God's forgiveness of them and of all past transgressions, firmly resolve not to offend him any more;
