### PROVINCIAL LUNATIC ASYLUM, TORONTO.

Two and a half miles west from the City Hall, on Queen Street. Property vested in the Crown. Government appoint Medical Superintendent, and Bursar, and Inspectors who frame by-laws for its government, thoroughly examine the Asylum, and report to the Inspectors of Asylums. The admission of patients is regulated by the Act 16 Vic., chap. 188, which requires that the patient be examined by three licensed medical practitioners, verified by Reeve or Mayor collectively, who certify to the insanity. Application for admission must be made before sending lunatics. Idiots, and persons afflicted with paralysis are inadmissable.
