7. First flight in Canada of Drome No. 4, McCurdy's Silver-Dart, Feb. 23, 1909. Upper picture taken by Mr. J. G. Davidson shows the Silver-Dart in the air (Feb. 23) against the sky with Washabuck in the background. The lower picture taken by Mr. Benner (Feb. 23) shows the Silver-Dart just as she was about to alight after her flight, with a portion of Beinn Bhreagh in the background.....58

8. Second flight of the Silver-Dart over the ice on Baddeck Bay Feb. 24, 1909. McCurdy Aviator. Three photos. Upper picture, gives a near view of the Silver-Dart in the air (Feb. 24) with McCurdy as aviator. Middle picture, shows the Silver-Dart (Feb. 24) at a little greater distance away, off the Baddeck side of the bay opposite the McCurdy Homestead. Lower picture, gives a distant view of the Silver-Dart (Feb. 24) against the Beinn Bhreagh shore. The sleigh on the shore contains Mrs. Bell and her party.....59

9. Second flight of the Silver-Dart on Baddeck Bay Feb. 24, 1909, the beginning and the end. Upper picture, the beginning. This shows the Silver-Dart with McCurdy on board on its way to the starting place. It will be noticed that Mr. Curtiss, having no skates, has stolen a ride on the machine. Lower picture illustrates the end of the experiment (Feb. 24), showing the condition of the Silver-Dart after landing. The damage is not as great as one would think from the photograph, and at the present date (Feb. 26) the repairs have practically been completed.....60
