Empire in Wartime Has Become Dependent Upon Its Females

Rotterdam, Netherlands, Oct. 19. — (Correspondence of The Associa-ted Press)—The German Empire, to some extent, has become dependent upon women's labor, declares a German correspondent of the Nieuwe Rotterdam Courant.
