'The Way to Get Prohibition.' In an open letter to the Herald Mr. Edward Fulton, Bass River, explains the attitude of the Temperance Alliance on the question of prohibition.

Mr. Fulton, who is a Liberal in politics and also a prohibitionist, says the way to get prohibition is to withhold a vote from non-pledged candidates.

Repeating the aims and object of the Alliance movement Mr. Fulton among other timely things says:— It would really appear that the policy of the Nova Scotia Temperance Alliance is not yet clearly understood by many if we are to judge by the printed reports of the speeches of some of our leading public men.

It would seem from the arguments that these men use that the Alliance was working to destroy the Scott Act. The object of the Alliance is to destroy the license system utterly in Nova Scotia, in accordance with the wishes of the people in this Province, so frequently expressed.

If our public men do not understand the Alliance policy they should study it, and meet the issue fairly and squarely.

If they are for license in opposition to the Alliance, why not say so? It is clear as day that the continuance of present conditions means the continuance of the license system.

There is no way in sight to destroy that system, but to enact a Provincial prohibitory law. This is the plain English of the case. The liquor people understand this full well. It is time all our people woke up to the fact.

The present political parties will not take a stand for prohibition, but one of them, or both of them, will, just as soon as we elect men in sufficient numbers to demand that they do so.

The problem is a simple one. It is not the terribly profound and complex matter that many try to make as believe it is.

The electors can settle it any day they have an opportunity to go to the polls, by simply withholding their vote from any man who will not positively promise to vote for a prohibitory law for Nova Scotia.

Do not be longer deceived. Patching up old status has been carried on for years, always with the assurance that we are getting 'the best law on earth'; but the liquor traffic keeps right along unmoved, and a larger territory in Nova Scotia is under license than was a year or two ago.

Have we longer deceived with these old cries we will have ourselves to blame. It matters not what the candidate's politics may be, whether Liberal or Conservative, let him have your vote if he will give the pledge. Let him go without it if he will not.

This matter is of infinitely more importance than the mere matter of a party victory. The politicians have had their day for all the past years. It is time now for our questions to be considered.

To put the matter in a nutshell: We may stand by the Scott Act in every county where it is in force, and secure

all the amendments possible—it will not disturb the license law in operation, while Provincial prohibition will put every one of them out of business.

In the face of the statements spread broadcast at this time by the opponents of prohibition that the Alliance movement is purely a 'Conservative dodge' to catch votes, it is worthy of note that Mr. Edward Fulton is himself a Liberal, and a supporter of the Murray administration. But he is a consistent prohibitionist as well as independent enough to uphold his principles by the right of his own ballot.

If there were more such staunch temperance men in both parties, men who dare to vote for the right regardless of party affiliations, it would not be long before Nova Scotia would be rid of the demoralizing effects of the saloon.
