 in receipt of \$4,000.

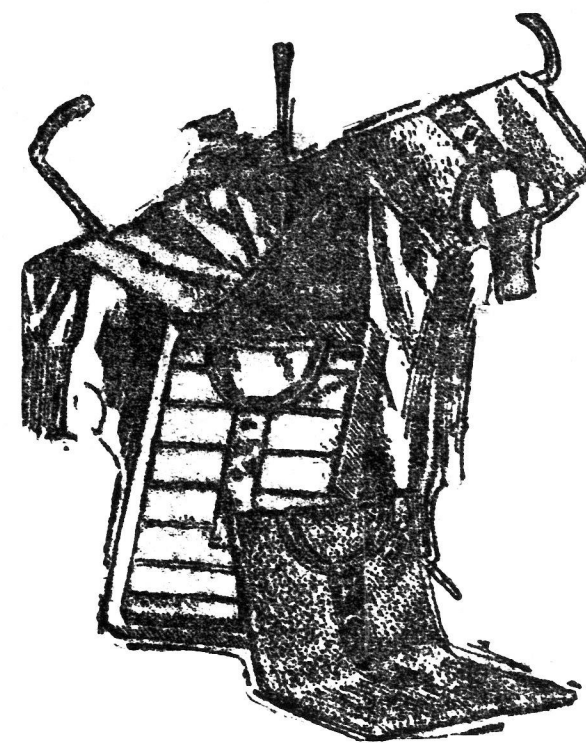
DIED OF BROKEN HEART.
