

Riel has proclaimed himself a prophet. The halfbreeds, should Riel astempt to desert them, would shoot him.

Lotte further says that after the Fish Oreck fight the rebels wanted to kill their laoners off hand, but Riel forbade them. Finally the rebel leader found it necessary to secrete the prisoners in a cellar. The halfbreeds are fairly well armed with rifles and shot guns, but the Indians have every kind of weapon, including rifles, shot guns, bows and arrows, clube, words, tomahawks and axes. Rifle pits have been dug at every place, and the insurgents believe they can at least hold out for several days, if indeed they cannot maintain their position for a week to come Their only difficulty is a scarcity of ammunition, and they are doing their best to remedy that deficiency by melting down everything available. Riel, Gabriel Dumont and the other rebel captains swear over and over again that they will never be taken alive. Riel has a daily seance, at which he professes to perform miracles and eleverly succeeds in deceiving

his followers : THE BATTLE. CLARKE'S CROSSING, N.W.T., May 10. -

Gen. Middleton engaged the rebels at Batoche yesterday, where they were, strongly posted in a ravine, the fight lasting from 8 in the morning till after 7 in the evening.
