BUTCHERED IN SWALLOW'S GAIL DENS BY JACK-THE-RIPPER.

Murdered Woman When the Crime Was Committed—Her Head Almosi Severed from Her Body—An Arrest on

LONDON, Feb. 18.—Further particulars in regard to the woman who was found dead in the Whitechapel district this morning, and who is supposed to have been murdered by Jack the Ripper, show that she is about ber-street. The archway referred to is, duroughfare, especially used by railway employes and stablemen in passing to and from their residences in and about that neighborhood to their work. At all times in the night pedestrians passing about and through "Swallow's Gardens," but nobody seems to have heard any cries of an alarming nature during the early hours this morning, when females and was known as "Carroty Nell."
