

SANCTITY AND MORALITY.—Archdeacon Manning on the Unity of the Church, makes the following just distinction between sanctity and that integrity of life, to which the world is wont to award the praise of perfect virtue.

"Among those that are severed from the unity of the Church may often be found a rigid morality, but little of the unearthly temper which marks the Catholic Saints. We often see strict truth, integrity, and benevolence, but little of the conscious awe of God's invisible presence, the subjugation of passion and denial of self, which distinguishes a Saint from a Philosophic Moralist. We shall often see, likewise, much zeal, forwardness, and energy in action, but little of the meekness, self-withdrawal, and devout humility which is the crowning glory of Christ's example. In fact, out of the unity of the Church we see the commoner virtues, which the world in part knew before Christ's coming, carried higher by the strength of Christianity; but of the higher graces, which the world never dreamed of, and which were manifested in Christ only, we can trace but faint lines anywhere, except in the Church alone. The reason of this seems evident. In no other body is there the divinely adjusted discipline for the will of man. The plastic energy by which the character of Christ is remoulded in the organic structure through which the fitness and harmony of moral truth prescribe its action; just as the animal life fails of throwing out the highest forms of health where the bodily organization is maimed or wanting."
