SALES have been large during the week, and prices remain firm. There is a good supply of everything excepting hemlock and spruce, of which there is a scarcity; also of common grades of pine particularly 1 1/2 inch siding. The demand is active for the latter. Freight remains unchanged, and vessels are scarce. The receipts at the Canal Collector's Office during the week were: via Erie Canal, 6,510,565 feet of lumber, and 181 M shingles; via Champlain Canal, 6,259,633 feet of Lumber.
