These heretics could be accused anonymously, and it was not considered necessary to bring the accused and the accuser face to face. The accused heretic was

conveyed to the chambers of the inquisition and rigidly kept from all intercourse with the outside world. No relative or friend to condole with him or to advise him was permitted to come into his presence. He was kept in ignorance of the charge upon which he was incarcerated. Counsel was allowed him, but this was a mere formality, for his counsel was not allowed to confer with him.

If the prisoner refused to confess his guilt, or was caught in evasions or contradictions, he was conveyed to the torture chamber, where he was submitted to the intensest agony which it was possible for human nerves to sustain. Doubtless many innocent men

declared themselves guilty under this exquisite torture in order to escape the terrible agony. Indeed, death was preferable to the torment.

The evidence upon which the heretics were convicted seems to us entirely insufficient. "The presumptive proofs," them may deserve notice.
