At the close of a session protracted somewhat beyond the

usual duration, I have great pleasure in releasing you from further attendance upon your Legislative duties.

Though your labors have not been marked by the perfection of any measure of prominent importance, I attribute that circumstance, in some degree, to the difficulties incident to the first session of a new House, distinguished as this Las been by an unprocedented change in the personnel of the Representative body, as contrasted with that which preceded it, whilst I trust that the general results of your deliberations will be found to have improved the social and

political conditions of the people.

That a bill, on the subject of Education, introduced in accordance with an announcement in my opening Speech, has not resulted in nutured legislation, is, to my mind, considering the vast difficulties which surround that question,

sucring the vast annealities which surround that question, a matter of regret rather than surprise or of disappointment. The discussion of the assessment principle, its adoption by the House for the first time in our Legislative History, and the publication of the Bill, which you have wisely ordered, will doubtless elicit an expression of public opinion that will facilitate your renewed deliberations on this important subject, if such shall be thought advisable in a future Session.
