

## ADJOURNED ANNUAL MEET-ING AND SOCIAL.

HE attendance at this meeting (held on Tuesday evening, 14th inst.) was very satisfactory. Tea was served in the Upper Reading-room at 6.30, and at 7.30 the Chair was taken by S. Caldecott, Esq. After devotional exercises and a brief address by the Chairman, upon "St. Paul as an example to Christian workers," the Chairmen of the following Committees presented their Annual Reports:—Reception—Waterside—Visiting—Railway— Employment-Boys, and Deaf Mute.
