He has now issued an address to his parishioners, stating that he has finally decided upon taking this step. While I desire to love all who love our Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity, yet I have been and am a Churchman, not only by birth and training, but also by conviction, therefore the sacrifice in severing official connection with my flock is severing official connection with my flock is very great. I respect the law. I cannot honorably evade its devision. Hence there remains for me but one course—separation. I shall abandon my position with pain, yet feel thankful that I have the courage to according to the standard of my belief.—In a postseript to this address Dr. Greeg adds:—Since the foregoing was written I have had the honor to receive (quite unexpectedly and altogether unsought for by me) poetedly and altogether unsought for by me) "cordial and unanimous invitation" to a "cordial and unanimous invitation" to become the incumbent of a church and congregation, the members of which have recently in a body ceased to worship in the Church of England as by law established. That invitation I have cordially accepted (subject to the termination of my ministry here). It is our intention to build, as seen as possible, a church where we shall have the privilege of using the old Liturgy, which as possible, a church where we shall have the privilege of using the old Liturgy, which all Church people love, but without the sacerdotalism which all Evangelical Church people deplore. It is intended also to adopt a Revised Book of Common Prayer, differ-ing from the present book (in use in the a Revised Book of Common Prayer, differing from the present book (in use in the Church of England) only in having everything of a sacordotal tendency carefully excluded. Thus we shall not have either a new book or a new Church, but we shall rotain the old book revised, and still belong to the dear old Church referenced. to the dear old Church reformed.
