PRIZE MEDAL 1851.

The Military Court which investigated the history of the disaster to the French army at Langron, during the Tonquin war, has acquitted Col. Bingen, who had charge of the French troops, from all blame of the disaster.

A rifle volunteer drill-hall, built at a cost of £6,000, and which provides standing accommodation for over 10,000 persons, was opened at Portsmouth, England, on Monday, 18th January, by General Sir George Willis.
