### Market Situation and Outlook

- Imports of round herring dropped dramatically, particularly product for food use (imports from USA are shucked for roe).
- Because of decrease in Norwegian resource, there is renewed interest by Japanese to source product in Canada currently.
- Demand for food herring very weak due to abundant supply of other low priced species e.g. squid, mackerel, jack mackerel.
