

Wheat, Grain, etc.—(Concluded)

8. Order,—Return showing data *re* number of bushels of wheat sold in the crop year 1952-53, by Wheat Board and by elevator companies and licensed grain dealers, etc.: Mr. Argue, 608. Presented, 671. Sess. Paper No. 123i.
9. Order,—Return showing data *re* number of bushels of wheat in each grade from No. 1 Northern, to feed, both tough and damp, were artificially dried in the crop year 1951-52, etc.: Mr. Argue, 608. Presented, 709. Sess. Paper No. 123j.
10. Order,—Return showing data *re* Wheat Board receipts of tough grain by grades for the crop year 1952-53, etc.: Mr. Argue, 802. *Presented forthwith.* Sess. Paper No. 123k.
11. Order,—Return showing subsidies paid to millers on wheat milled in each year since 1939; payment to farmers per bushel on wheat consumed in Canada since 1939, etc.; and amount of beef and other meat products bought by Britain each year since 1939: Mr. McCullough (Moose Mountain), 450. *Presented forthwith.* Sess. Paper No. 123e.
12. Order,—Return showing data *re* terminal elevators at which weigh-overs have been made during the past twelve months, etc.: Mr. Argue, 451. *Presented forthwith.* Sess. Paper No. 123d.
13. Order,—Return showing the total production of flax in bushels during each of the last five years, etc.: Mr. Hansell, 653. Presented, 672. Sess. Paper No. 121d.
14. Proposed motion, Mr. Drew, to adjourn House for the purpose of discussing the need for a government policy with respect to the loss of farm markets for wheat and the means to be taken to protect producers from detrimental policies and practices of other countries: Mr. Speaker decided that the matter was not one of urgency within the meaning of "urgency" under Standing Order 31. Motion not put from Chair, 716.
15. Motion for House to go into Committee of Supply, 726. Amendment (Mr. Drew): The government should make an immediate declaration as to its policy respecting the marketing of our wheat surplus; moved, 727. Sub-amendment (Mr. Argue): To include in such policy provision for a floor price to wheat producers, etc., moved and debate adjourned, 727. Amendments ruled out of order, 754-5.
16. Amendment (Mr. Harkness) to motion for House to go into Committee of Supply: government has failed to deal effectively with problem of marketing wheat surplus; moved, 757. Subamendment (Mr. McCullough, Moose Mountain): and to make provision for a floor price to wheat producers, etc., moved, 757. Debate resumed, 758, 759, 765. Subamendment negatived, 765; amendment negatived, 767.
