The Mission Board presented the follow-

ing report:

1. That the grant from the Mission Fund to the Rev. J. Jacobs be increased to \$400 a year from the 1st of October last, as the grant from the Church Missionary Society has been withdrawn, and the Indian Mission is now left entirely dependent upon the Church Society, with the exception of a small grant received from the Colonial and Continental Church Society.

2. An application was made by the Rev. W. B. Evans for some assistance towards the expenses of keeping up the services periodic lly at two stations in the vacant Mission of Artemesia and Ospry.

The Roard recommended a grant of \$75 to Rev. W. B. Evans, for expenses incurred in keeping up the services in the vacant Mission of Artemesia and

Uspry. \$25 to be paid on 1st of Jan., next, \$25 on April 1st, \$25 on July 1st.

3 Rev. E Softley applied to have the arrears due to him by the Mission of Holland and Sullivan paid to him by the

The Board cannot recommend this as the Mission Fund By-Law states that the Society is only bound for that portion of

the stipend promised by this Society.
4. Rev. I. Barr applied to have his Mis-

sion placed on the \$300 list.

Under the present position of the Mission Fund the Board cannot recommend this to the Society.

5 Rev. H. Bartlett applied for a grant of \$100, on account of arrears due by the congregations in his Mission.

The Board cannot recommend the So-
