ANOTHER CONFERENCE OVER RADIAL LINES

Municipalities Between Markham and Collingwood Discuss Plans for Proposed Scheme.

Delegates chosen from the ten or twelve municipalities between Markham and Collingwood, met in the offices of the Provincial Hydro Commission yesterday to confer regarding the outlook for the building of a radial line between these two points. They were met by Sir Adam Beck, P.E.C. chief engineer, and other officers of the commission. The discussion was largely informal, the idea being to get as much information regarding the cost of construction and other data as possible. Engineers have gone carefully over the proposed route and the members of the commission and the delegates were unanimous in the plan to submit at the date to the councils of their respective municipalities at the earliest moment. The proposed line is to deviate from the accepted trunk line paralleling the Midland Railway at a point at or near Unionville, switching to the north and west on to Barrie, Collingwood and other points.

SALVO OF CHEERS GREETED TROOPS

Guns Boomed Out Welcome for the Ninety-Fifth Battalion.

HOT DINNER APPEAL

Citizens Rally to Call of Mayor Who Wants Meals for the Soldiers.

HAMILTON, Thursday, Nov. 4.

Welcomed as they had just returned from the front, the 92nd Battalion under the command of Lt.-Col. Chisholm, taking part in the great military trek from Niagara Camp to Toronto, yesterday received a reception upon their entry into this city that for enthusiasm eclipsed all former affairs of that kind tendered to various battalions that have passed through here.

As the men swung past Gore Park to the strains of "Tipperary," thousands of people who packed the square cheered as one. Stores and offices were left empty, while those who could not leave crowded the windows to aid in the demonstration. Two or three of the large stores had small guns mounted on the roofs of their buildings and fired up a continual cannonade during the passing of the troops.

Fine Body of Men.

The battalion, which was composed of a particularly fine body of men, Camp to Hamilton without a single casualty. Splendid time was made in the march, the battalion leaving Grimsby at 8:40 in the morning and arriving in this city at 4:25 in the afternoon. The stop for night was made about one mile and a half on the side of Stony Creek, but the inhabitants refused to miss their part as they had done at the former battalions, and sent out members filled with pies and fruit to them.

To show their appreciation, the 92nd Battalion Band stopped in the village after they had resumed the march, and for half an hour held a band concert.

During the trek, a series of engagements with the enemy were carried out, and it was only by the most skilful strategy of the 92nd advance guard that a general engagement was frustrated and the enemy driven back from capturing their transports. Operations very determined flanking movements on the part of the enemy were made, but the battalion's advance guard extended themselves from the enemy to make a general retreat to avoid the superior force of the battalion.

DUCKWORTH'S PLEA IS NOT GUILTY

Father Makes Defence of Son Charged With Grand Valley Murder.

ONTARIO POLICE ACT

Inspector Boyd Will Investigate Sordid Conditions Prevailing in Family.

GRAND VALLEY, Nov. 3.—Today a pitiful scene in connection with the shooting of Harry Strutt, the Grand Valley farm laborer, on November 2, of which his brother-in-law Thomas Duckworth is accused, took place when the funeral was held. Not one relative was present and when the coffin was lifted from an open hearse at the Union Cemetery, two newspapermen assisted in lowering the body into the grave. The Anglican clergyman of the village read the Church of England burial service and his voice was often drowned by howling wind which swept across the common. Besides these three undertaker, A. E. Burrows, and his assistant, were the only ones who took part in the burial. Mrs. Strutt, the mother of the murdered man, and her brother, Toronto in the morning and on her way to the Duckworth home pleaded to be allowed to see her son, but her appeal was not granted.

Found the Gun.

Early this morning County Constable J. Brown set out to search for the gun with which it is stated Duckworth did the shooting and after an hour's search in the Duckworth house and in the adjoining buildings he was informed by Hamilton Duckworth, who had been watching the search, that his brother had taken it with him. The county constable immediately set out on the road to the place where the gun was finally located the previous day. Fully concealed under a rail near the gate of Duncan Warden's farm, Brown believed to be a 44 calibre magazine rifle, but would not allow the reporters to see the gun, which was loaded.

Thomas Jordan, the owner of the house in which the murder was committed, was interviewed this afternoon near the scene of the tragedy. He stated that there was no written lease made when Duckworth took the house, but there was a verbal agreement that the prisoner was to vacate when asked. Jordan intimated that it was principally his fault that he had let the house in the first place, because Thomas Duckworth had been turned out of his former dwelling and his furniture put on the road.

"Did you seek legal advice before evicting him," he was asked, and he replied that he did not think it was necessary.

Complaints Made.

Jordan would not say whether any money for rent had been received, but he volunteered the information that the eviction was made as a result of many complaints from the neighbors regarding the conduct of the prisoner. He said that a review of the circumstances the furniture had been put back in the house, but when asked he stated that there were no occupants. It was stated that the whole family left for Toronto on Samuel and William Duckworth, the father and brother of the dead man, who had been in the village today, and when interviewed they were asked to sign a statement as "the best of the family" in his son. He said it was purely a family quarrel and to some extent he upheld the action of his son. The statement was unswerving guests at the house; he had been in Toronto and he would have chided them with an ax, he said.

Engages Counsel.

Duckworth has engaged a lawyer, Hughson of Orangeville for the defence, and stated that he would give his son anything he wanted to help him win out.

MANY OFFERS TO RAISE REGIMENTS

Sir Max Aitken Would Raise Battalion in New Brunswick.

WESTERNERS EAGER

HYDRO BYLAW CARRIED BY SMALL MAJORITY

Niagara Falls, Ontario, Adopts System on Light Vote—Money Measure Passes.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Nov. 3.—In a special vote taken today the Hydro-Electric bylaw was carried by 48 of a majority. Not 80 per cent. of the registered vote was polled. The city has been getting power from the Ontario Power Co. at a much lesser rate by the commutation of taxes. The interest will be for thirty years at 11.50 per horsepower present, with one dollar per horsepower extra for sinking fund, and a minimum of 2000 horsepower. The money bylaw for \$14,000 for machinery in electric plant in connection with above bylaw was carried by only 2 of a majority. The municipal bakery bylaw was defeated by vote of 2 to 1.

CANADA'S WAR LOAN CAMPAIGN PLANNED

Hon. W. T. White Will Make Direct Appeal to Public.

NO PRIVATE PROFITS

Probably Fifty Million Dollars Will Be the Amount Asked.

OTTAWA, Nov. 3.—Hon. W. T. White, finance minister, announces that the Canadian war loan, which will be offered in Canada only, will be advertised during the last week of the present month. Duke of Connaught will head the list of subscribers.

Mr. White is asking all financial institutions and the public generally to be prepared to participate. He saw the officers of the Canadian Life Assurance Companies in Montreal yesterday, and today he met with the full executive committee of the Canadian Bankers' Association here respecting the part these organizations will play in participating in the loan. During the next three weeks Mr. White expects to be continuously engaged in organizing for the campaign at the end of November.

Cut Out Middlemen.

Mr. White has decided to be his own underwriter, and to save himself writing expenses and profits. He will handle the loan directly himself, and will advertise directly in every daily newspaper in Canada, and will attend to all the organizing for the campaign.

Details as to amount, price or terms of issue will be given out until the prospectus is issued. However, it is taken for granted that the amount will be \$50,000,000. This is a large amount for Canada to raise, but Mr. White is confident that the nation will prove a success. It is believed that there will be issues of small denominations, probably \$500, so that the public generally will be able to subscribe.
