- into canoe* (la—, to go); gyā'-qasala, to come in canoe; gua'-qela, to sit in —; mō'qasala, to loud —; **H.** lōpq̄s, empty canoe (lōp, empty); laqsut, to load canoe (la—, to go; —ut, v. a.); goa'qs, to sit in —; **G.** laqs, to go into —; wā'meqsūt, to load —; goa'qsala, to sit in —.
- lying on side, **N.** kō'k'oath; kō'k'omā'lis, canoe lying on side in front of beach.
- adrift, **H.** k-auk'oansela/k-tlē (—tlē, on surface of sea).
- han—; this stem probably means a hollow vessel (see Kettle), and is used in composition with local suffixes; **N.** ha'nk'amll̄s, canoe landing in front of beach (—k'am, in face of; —ll̄s, beach); hanhs'i-wāē, canoe at mouth of river (—slwāē, river mouth); hanuē'lagytlē, canoe is on water; **H.** hana'qtis (gyi'-loaq), canoe is on beach; hanā'-eas gyi'loaq, canoe is on water; hanā'laktl̄a, canoe at anchor; hanē'sēs gyilon, place of canoes in forest; **G.** hanē'lwā'paqt̄, canoe is on water.
- place of — in forest, **H.** tlq'-ēā'sē.
- out of canoe, —otl̄t; **N.** gyaqotlā'-lisaisus, he brought one out of canoe to beach; **G.** wā'mōltl̄t, to unload.
- to make canoe, **H.** ȳ'tl'a; ȳ'tl'eskīō, canoe builder.
- cap, dancing —, **N.** ts'ē'qeoē (ts'ēk—, secrets, winter dance; —eoē—, forehead).
- capable of —, **N.** ts'ēs; dō'q̄s's̄s, seer; **H.** —ts̄s; k-ā'wates, with good power of hearing.
- cape, **N.** wāqsā, **H.** ȳa'qsiwa.
- to capsized, **L.** k'apā', **H.** k'paē'; **k'pē'tla**, something turned upside down; **k'pē'tla-itl̄**, something turned upside down on floor.
- to take care of —, **N.** aā'qisla; tlā'-tlaqslla, taking care of cedar-bark rings (tlā'k'ok', cedar-bark ornament); mā'menatilla, taking care of drums (?) (mānā'tsē, drum; —ila, to make; probably drum maker).
- to treat carefully, cautiously, **N.** mā'-yahila.
- something one does not care for, one does not want to keep, **N.** wā'iat (w—, negation).
- cariboo, **H.** tl'aqt̄.
- to carry in hand, **N.** dā'la, —enk-ula, nātsemēnk'olawis, always carrying two round ones in hand; mamō'sk'amēnk'ola, carrying four round ones in hand.
- to carry into house, **H.** laai'tla (la—, to go; —itl̄, in house).
- to carry on back, **N.** mōē'gyint (—igya, back).
- to carry load into canoe, **L.** mā'wa (see To load).
- carrying something in mouth, **N.** tē'-kuqsta (—qsta, mouth); k-ē-tyeqstil̄s, — outside (see To bite, —qsta, mouth; —ll̄s, outside); k-ētyeqstā'litl̄, — in house.
- to carry fire, **H.** pē'h'it (?).
- to carve meat, **L.** k'ā'qit; k'ōā'laiō, carving knife.
- carved figure, **N.** ky'ēk'.
- carving knife, **L.** k'il'k'uatlām, k'ōā'-tlaō, **H.** ky'ē'olem.
