## CHURCH OF ENGLAND IN NEWPORT.

THE township of Newport lies on the eastern side of the river St. Croix. It is one of the six subdivisions of Hants county, and in importance ranks next to Windsor. In consequence of the proclamations issued by that excellent and popular man, Governor Lawrence, in the years 1758-9, many substantial farmers from Boston, Rhode Island, New London and Plymouth, arrived in Nova-Scotia, determined to settle in districts most avorable to the prosecution of agriculture. port was considered one of these, and in the year 761 it was granted in seventy shares. ownship comprises fifty-eight thousand acres. Of these, fifteen hundred are good dyked land, wo hundred are salt marsh, and some few are ntervale, Gypsum and lime abound, and the ormer has been extensively quarried and exported o the United States. It is also said to posses he best freestone quarry in the Province.
