

Controller Church Again Denies His Own Interviews

Declared in Council That He Made No Statement Regarding Civic "Frame-up" Despite Fact That He Gave Information in the World Office Last Friday—Humber Valley Scheme Turned Down—Board of Control to Report on Architect's Department—Swifts Get Market Lease.

The Humber Valley scheme received another setback yesterday, when the city council by a vote of 9 to 8 threw out the proposal to expropriate properties on the Humber River which must be acquired by the city in order to carry out its contract with K. Home Smith.

"We should direct our attention more to the eastern section of the city," said Ald. McBride, "as we have enough property out west, and the acquisition of the Humber Valley property will have a detrimental effect on the city treasury to build bridges that are not safe."

Ald. Wanless also wanted more attention given to the east, but "we have to plan for the future," he declared. "The city will extend beyond the Humber in a few years and for this reason alone the city should acquire land for future park purposes."

Controller Church opposed the bylaw on the grounds that the city did not come forward with a definite scheme. "There is no use in acquiring land when you have no idea as to what use you will put it to. If you wish to use it for park purposes, all well and good, but I want to know what scheme you have on hand before I give it my support."

Ald. Sanderson also made an appeal for expropriation of land for park purposes in the east, and he would not give the bylaw his support because he thought the west had sufficient parks already.

Controller McCarthy informed the aldermen that the city was prepared to acquire land wherever it was needed for open spaces, whether it be in the east or western sections of the city.

Robbins Takes Seat.

Introduced by Ald. Hilton the newly elected alderman, W. J. Robbins, for Ward One, was introduced to Mayor Geary and council yesterday afternoon.

Controller Hocken brought up the question of a so-called "frame-up" to divide municipal offices, as reported, for the express purpose of giving it a complete denial.

He read the articles and asked Controller Foster if he really did say what has been attached to his name. "If the controller did make such statements, then he acted in a very derogatory manner."

Controller Hocken wanted to say that he had nothing to do with any such "frame-up" and wanted to say so publicly.

"I think when I am charged with going into a deal of this kind, it is only in order that I should give out a flat denial."

Controller Church denied ever making any statement with regard to any civic appointments, despite the fact that he was in the World office and gave the information last Tuesday evening.

Ald. Austin withdrew his motion that Dr. Hastings' salary should be increased from \$500 to \$550 per annum at the doctor's request.

Ald. Wanless introduced an order to regulate the number of civic employees.

Ald. Robbins was appointed to a seat on the island committee in place of Ald. Sanderson, and he replaced ex-council member Ald. Chisholm on the property committee.

Ald. Austin moved a much-discussed motion for a reorganization of the architect's department; also to have an investigation with a view to increasing its efficiency and methods.
