Robertson in respect of non-navi-gable waters and extends the same prule of law to all navigable rivers and great lakes the beds of which are wholly in the provinces, the right of fishing therein being a public common right, subject to provincial legislation. By the judgment to-day the Domin-fon is confined to the powers of con-servancy and regulation of fisheries. The Dominion has power to enact the imposition of a general license upon imposition of a general license upon all persons fishing, but such licenses: cannot be restricted to any particular locality.
