Trade was very dull in the early part of the day, but picked up in the noon. Prices remained unchanged for porters, but declined from 10c to 8c for butchers. Hides were exported sold at \$4 to \$4.25. Corn choice cattle brought \$1.00 more. Exported hogs sold for \$1.00 per bush, heavy, at \$3.75; light, at \$3.50. The best of butchers' stock sold at \$3.00; the good at \$2.55 to \$3.10; the good at \$2.40; the common at \$2.30; inferior rough cows and calves at \$3 per cwt.

There were large numbers of fresh stockers on the market. Feeder prices firm and unchanged, stock at \$3.30 to \$3.50, and feeders at \$3.10 per cwt.
