# WELCOME TO OTTAWA DEAD IN HIS 51ST YEAR

Sir George Baden-Powell  
With the Great Majority.

## HIS ENERGETIC CAREER.

Was an Eminent Political Economist  
and Authority on Colonial Affairs.

Represented the Kirkdale Division  
of Liverpool in the Conservative  
Interests Since 1885—His Work as  
an Author — Visited Canada in  
1886 in Connection With the

London, Nov. 20.—Sir George Smyth  
Baden-Powell the eminent political econ

mist and authority on colonial affairs, who has represented the Kirkdale Division of Liverpool in Parliament in the Conservative interests since 1885, died to-day in his 75th year.

Sir George, who was born at Oxford on Dec. 24, 1847, was a son of well-known Rev. Baden-Powell, Professor of Geometry at the University of Oxford, whose Magna Opus was written to demonstrate that science and revelation are in harmony.

Sir George's mother was a daughter of the distinguished British Admiral Smith. He was prepared for Oxford at Marlborough, and graduated from the University with honors in 1878, winning the Chancellor's Gold Medal.

lor's prize for the English essay. In the interlude between leaving Marlborough and taking up his University residence, he traveled in India and Australia, and visited the principal European cities, as well as the Cape.

The first year of his University career saw published his "New Homes for the Old Country." This important book was pronounced by The London Times a "standard work." The London Athenaeum declaring it to be "an encyclopedia of Australian knowledge." This volume was followed by two on political economy, "Protection and Retardation," and "State Aid and State Interference."

In 1880 he went to the West Indies to investigate the effect of the sugar bounty system on West India sugar plant, and two years later Mr. Gladstone appointed him a special commissioner to report upon the

In 1885 he went to South Africa and joined Sir Charles Warren in Bechuanaland assisting him in diplomatic negotiations.

In the winter of 1886-87 he was in Canada and the United States drawing up

In the autumn of 1887 the British Government sent him to Malta as the colleague of Sir George Bowen, who arranged the details of the new Maltese constitution. At this time, that he recorded

In 1891 he was appointed joint commissioner on the condition of seal life Behring Sea, and in the following year participated in the deliberations of the joint commission at Washington.

He was a most industrious and prolific writer, a keen sportsman, and, socially, a great favorite in the House of Commons.
