The Consolidated Lake Superior Power Company, which is the corporate name of the owners of the industrial and power properties at both the American and Canadian ends of the Soo locks, which project from the American shore of the St. Mary's river, is in a state of financial crisis.

FATE SETTLED TO-DAY.

New York, Sept. 20.—The future of the \$30,000,000 Consolidated Lake Superior Power Company, which controls a dozen more industrial, including steel mills, traction systems, ferries, railways, pulp and paper mills and light and power companies on or near the St. Mary's river, is likely to be determined at the meeting of the full board of directors in the city tomorrow.

The largest plant that hasn't been built in this country is the mill 1000 feet long, which is more than twice as long as the national capitol at Washington, and that cannot run at its full capacity for 30,000 tons a day, the greater part of which would be wages.

The company paid dividends on the preferred stock until December last, but the money was not paid out for many months, which was a temporary relief in March by a loan of \$5,000,000 from a syndicate of banks.

The Lake Superior Consolidated Company owns a nickel mine in the Soo, and it is reported that the company is planning to build a new plant at the Soo.

Worse Than Ever Before. Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Sept. 20.—G. N. W. Despatch.—The shutting down of the Consolidated Lake Superior Company's plants, shutting off \$7000 a day in wages alone, has caused a panic in the Canadian Soo, which is in a worse condition than ever before in its history.

In addition to this, the police department is swearing in a large number of men to take the place of the men who are being laid off.

At the end of the present contract another company is now ready to be inaugurated with 100 pens entered, ten from the United States, ten from England, three from Canada, and two from New Zealand.
