

THE KRAZ POTEMKINE

Mutineers on Kraz Potemkine Disappoint Odessa Crowds That Watched for Naval Battle—“Yield or Be Sunk” was Kruger’s Alternative—Now on Their Way to Sebastopol—Sailors at Cronstadt Strike.

Odessa, June 30.—Without firing a shot or the slightest show of resistance, the Kraz Potemkine has hauled down the red flag and surrendered the battleship to Vice-Admiral Kruger’s squadron which arrived here at noon today. It was an anxious moment for Odessa, as the squadron of five battleships and seven torpedo boats, with their crews at quarters and their decks cleared for action, steamed within range of the Kraz Potemkine, whose flag flying signals which read: “Yield or be sunk.”

The display of force was too overwhelming for the mutineers, and all thought of resistance was abandoned. Admiral Kruger ordered the Ekaterinok to place a crew on board the Kraz Potemkine and the other vessels of the squadron immediately sailed away.

The mutineers will be transferred to the Ekaterinok. They are being held in tents in Cathedral-square, and four batteries of artillery, well supplied with ammunition, had been placed in the park, and at Langerson.

Cleared for Action.

The Kraz Potemkine was seen to be clearing for action, and the squadron lay midway between the shore and the Ekaterinok, with her broadsides pointed respectively towards the town and the squadron, but the mutineers were not to be attacked by Kruger’s ships. In addition to its own crew, the Kraz Potemkine was carrying a full complement of sailors and officers, but the workmen continue to strike.
