

SCORES TRYING PHYSICAL TEST OF DRAFT ARMY

Applicants Line Armories Today and On Saturday, Awaiting Examination.

EIGHT MEN SIGNED UP That Many Joined Colors Overseas Units.

Lines of applicants at the armories today and returns for Saturday, which show that twenty civilians came before a medical board to discover whether or not they were eligible for the services of the draft army.

Only five of the twenty men who were examined on Saturday were placed in class "A2," which indicates fitness to serve with a combatant unit.

Three were class "B," which indicates fitness for non-combatant units. The remaining twelve of the score were unfit for any branch of the army.
