REFORMATORY USED **'COLD WATER DASH**

"Liberty" Organization Plans Girls Tell of Inmates Being Handcuffed to Cells at Bedford Institution.

MADE TO STAND ON TOES

Superintendent Testifies That Water Treatment Was to Reduce Congestion in Head.

The woman is specifically charged with having knocked down a woman guard and blackened her eye when she tried to take her to the disciplinary building on August 25. Through her counsel, Humphrey J. Assistant District Attorney Thomas F. McKennell brought out from Miss Cobb, the superintendent of the reformatory, that during the past three years there had been 1,000 inmates in the institution and that only fifteen of them had been given the cold water treatment or had been handcuffed to the cell doors.

Inmates at the institution testified that a pail of water was thrown on a girl's head for punishment or else her head was forced in a bucket of cold water.

"What was the purpose of this treatment?" McKennell asked Miss Cobb.

"It was done to reduce blood congestion in the head of the girl." she said, and added that this treatment was carried out because of the behavior of girls who suffered from overwrought nerves. and added that this treatment was carried out because of the behavior of girls who suffered from overwrought nerves, who suffered from overwrought nerves. Those who had been smashing window panes, having violent temper, or using bad language. The witness said it was more for a correctional measure than for punishment and that if it was of no benefit the Idea was stopped.

The superintendent was asked by Lawyer Lynch how the girls were handcuffed, and she said their hands were placed behind their back, handcuffs adjusted, and then another pair of handcuffs were attached and these were fastened to the cell door. Witnesses testified that the stringing up process was in conjunction with the cold water process to quiet the girls and make them tractable.
