The disolution of the monasteries in the sixteenth century brought chaos and 300 years of decay for the nursing profession. However, in the seventeenth century the Society of St. Vincent de Paul brought somewhat of a revival. This organization now has 2,000 hospitals, orphanages and other charities in 24 countries of the world.

Model for Both.

The speaker then traced the rise of modern scientific nursing in the nineteenth century. The Fliedner Institute on the Rhine was the first training school for Europe. "The modest woman," said Dr. Wood, "whom the nursing profession should rise to the highest pedestal is Elizabeth Fry, founder in 1840 of her training school in Whitechapel, London, a model for both England and America."

Meeting in London.

One of these meetings was held in London on Wednesday, when Superinintendent F. Price of the car service department in Montreal adressed between 80 and 100 officials from every part of the local division, both east and west of the city. 


