CHIEF JUSTICE BARKER HONORED BY BARRISTERS

Dinner Tendered to Him at Union Club Last Evening Was an Especially Happy Function--Guest of Honor the Recipient of Many Heartfelt Tributes.

The banquet which was tendered by the Barristers Society of New Brunswick in the Union Club Thursday to Hon. Frederick E. Barker in honor of his appointment as chief justice of the supreme court will long be remembered as one of the most representative gatherings of the legal profession here in many years.

The formal decorations on the tables were tastefully arranged in vases of which there were between fifty and sixty placed at short intervals. Roses, tulips, carnations and stocks blended with ferns and amilax made a charming combination in which the prevailing colors were pink and white.

The president then proposed the health of the King, which was honored with the national anthem. Hon. J. H. Barry, K. C., the vice-president, in proposing the toast to the chief justice, said that he was proud to have as a guest of honor the recipient of many complimentary references made.

LABOR LEADERS MUCH WORRIED Over the Ruling of the U. S. Supreme Court that Unions Are Trusts.

WASHINGTON, March 19.—A conference of far-reaching importance to labor began here Wednesday. Participating are the prominent labor leaders of the executive council of the American Federation of Labor together with the executives of the International Trade Union of America who met pursuant to a call issued by Mr. Gompers to consider the consequences of the recent injunction decisions of the supreme court of the United States affecting labor organizations with particular reference to the Danbury Hatters case in which that court substantially held that labor organizations were to be considered trusts as such organizations of capital.

After calling attention to the significance of these decisions Mr. Gompers stated that the conference was for the purpose of taking such action as the importance and merits of the subjects dealt with may be considered and determined as setting forth the position and demands of labor. The court's dealings, he said, were binding upon all labor organizations until changed or modified by congressional action.
