Indian Children. We appreciate very highly the interest taken by himself and Mrs. Tate in the management of this new branch of work; and we hope that, as they will now be free from the care that has rested upon them for the past two years, they may have increased blessing in their general missionary work, and have the satisfaction of seeing our ladies well established and successfully carrying out the designs of the institution."

"That this Board of Managers of the Woman's Missionary Society desires to express its hearty thanks to the Board of Missions of the Methodist Church for the favor of allowing Rev. C. M. Tate to spend so much time in the superintendence of the erection of our Home and School for Indian Children, at Chilliwhack, B.C. It is hoped that this institution, without being a further tax on him, will prove a great blessing to the mission station of which he has charge."

The following are some of the questions which were answered by a committee appointed for that purpose, composed of Mesdames Burns, Whiston, T. G. Williams, Willmott, and Miss Palmer:—

Have Auxiliaries formed during the year a right to send a delegate

to the Branch Annual Meeting? Ans. Yes.

Must Organizers be elected to the Branch Annual Meeting by their Auxiliaries? Not necessarily.

Should not Organizers be members of the Branch Meeting by virtue of their office? No such provision is made by the Constitution.

Mrs. Parker read a short report of her work as editress of the Woman's Missionary Society department of the *Outlook*, which told of a large increase in its circulation, and urged the members to increased diligence in securing new subscribers.

Various memorials and letters were received and referred to the appropriate committee, which subsequently reported as follows:—

The Committee recommend that this be entertained. After some discussion, the recommendation of the Committee was carried; also "that the question of erecting new buildings at Port Simpson for the Crosby Girls' Home be laid over until further
