THE WAR NEWS

General Joffre in congratulating Grand Duke Nicholas over the great victory won by the Russians over the Turks in the Caucasus made this significant statement: "By their constant and uninterrupted effort in all the theatres of operations the armies of the Allies are preparing the definite victories of the future."

AN ENERGETIC BODY

There is evidently a very energetic and progressive Chamber of Commerce in the city of Missoula, Montana. Among its plans for the present year is an industrial survey of resources and a plan of development for territory that is naturally tributary to Missoula.
