SCIENTISTS DISPEL FOG.
The first attempt to clear away the fog and smoke that continually obscure the atmosphere of Pittsburgh, particularly during the winter months, has just been made by local scientists, assisted by officials of the United States Weather Bureau.
The initial experiment, conducted on the Monongahela River, was pronounced a "distinct success." The official fog removers expressed themselves as confident that considerable "Pittsburgh gloom" will be avoided this fall and winter, provided moderate fogs are available.
The experiment consisted of lubricating the Monongahela River from Rice's Landing to a point one and one-half miles upstream.
Notified by the Weather Bureau that a cold wave would sweep through the

valley, scientists took the government boat Evelyn, a derrick and a barge fitted with sprinkling apparatus and proceeded to Rice's Landing. As the cold air and warmer water met and fog began to form, a spray of oil and organic acid was spread over a broad area of the river. The fog dissipated rapidly. The oil prevented union of the air and water.
They said another experiment made on a much broader scale, will be held at soon as the Weather Bureau forecasts another nice, thick fog.

City of Cleveland and State of Wyoming Have Special School Classes.
Defective children in the Cleveland public schools receive skilled training in industrial work, the products including toys, dresses, rugs and toys. Sometimes the boys bring broken articles from home to repair.
This work is carried on by seventy-three teachers in twenty centers, where there are 1,100 children. When these children reach the age of 16 many of them must go to work. The schools employ two social service workers, who not only help the children to get jobs but help them to keep in touch with their families after they leave school.
Similar work is being encouraged in industrial work, the State Board of Education pays a bonus of \$150 at the end of the school year to any school which has established an approved special class. Such classes must be formed in accordance with certain requirements by the State Director of Special Classes, such as the holding of a special certificate by the teachers of equipment and the provision of suitable facilities by standardized mental tests.
