Supreme Court decision as construed by counsel for Hart, however, laid down the principle that interstate com-merce consists of the transfer across state lines of some product of human effort. The production of vaudeville essentially entailed a product of human labor, it was argued, as well as a com-modity in which the property rights of the owners were recognized and protected by law.
