The executive of the Baptist Women's Missionary Union of the maritime provinces held their opening session yesterday in Germain street Baptist lecture rooms, Mrs. David Hutchinson presiding.

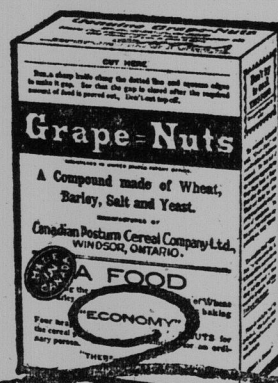
The executive were visited by three

members. Miss Eaton was given permission to go to New York to attend the Bible lectures at Dr. White's school during the winter months.

The treasurer reported receipts for the year \$5,671.83, while the general treasurer's report showed that the whole receipts for the year were \$37,469.37. Of this money \$7,306.25 was for the jubilee fund.

Miss Eaton and Mrs. W. E. McIntyre were appointed delegates to the missionary conference of North America at New Haven to take place the middle of January.

According to Vornarts, there were 32,493 births in Berlin in 1913; in 1914, 30,022; in 1915, 32,249; in 1916, 29,522; and in 1917 only 19,458. The number of deaths in the years 1913 to 1916 was about 26,500 but in 1917 it rose to 34,122.

EAT FISH AND SAVE MEAT

One of the best possible arguments for the increased use of fish in Canada is furnished in a resume of the live stock situation in Europe. The following figures, showing the enormous deficiency of live stock in some of the countries of Europe most affected by the war, give an idea of what Canada must do in the matter of increasing her herds and saving meat by the use of fish.

## THRIFT RECIPES

Issued by Canada Food Board.

### SQUASH PUDDING.

One and a half cups cooked and strained squash.  
Half teaspoon cinnamon.  
One-third cup sugar.  
Two eggs.  
Half teaspoon salt.  
One and a half cups milk.  
Grated rind half a lemon.  
Gradually add the milk to the strained squash, then the sugar, salt, seasoning, slightly beaten eggs and grated lemon-peel. Pour into a greased pudding dish and bake in a moderate oven until thickened like custard. Serve very cold.

## Food Board Flashes

It is estimated that \$4,000,000 worth of good food was wasted by kitchen carelessness before the outbreak of the war.
