### WANTS VALLEY RAILWAY BRIDGE AT BARLOW BLUFF

Milukah, N. B., Oct. 21.  
Sir:—I see by the daily press that resolutions have been passed by the board of trade and the Board of Council to have the Valley Railway bridge placed at Gondola Point instead of Perry's Point. As no mention has been made of placing the bridge further down the Kennebecasis, at or near Barlow Bluff, this securing railway communication for Kingston No. 2, and Westfield No. 2, I wish, through your paper, to draw their attention to it.

We need the railway in the worst way, as it would give us a telephone and telegraph service, a good postal service and access to the St. John markets at all times of the year.

It would also raise land values, as it is almost impossible to sell land except near the city for summer resorts. I am convinced that these places would in time become suburbs of the Greater St. John if we had railway communication.

Very service in the winter will always be uncertain and expensive, and an annual tax on the government, which would go a great distance towards saving the interest on the added cost of the bridge here. The route for the railway would be shorter and much local traffic would be secured.
