

WHOLESALE CONFECTIONERS

Floating factories have become an important part of the development of the forest resources of India. In certain parts the forests are only accessible through the watercourses, and the great expense of erecting land plants for the utilization of the lumber resources makes such a course impracticable. Therefore sawmills and other manufacturing establishments are built on floating platforms and moved up the streat as they are needed. After the lumber prepared in a sawmill it can be packed in a way that makes transportation much more economical than any system of logging.
