Thirty-Two Countries Sending 1,000 Physicians to Meetings in Washington

Washington, Sept. 20-One of the mos notable meetings of physicians and scientists ever held in America will begin in this city on September 23, when the International Congress on Hygiene and Demo graphy convenes. More than 5,000 physi cians and hygienists will participate. Pres of the congress, and will open its sessions The delegates will include 1,000 foreign physicians from thirty-two countries. Those Germany alone will number 250. Every state of the union will be represent-

ed. The conference will extend from Sept 23 to 28. Every phase of human health and hygiene will be considered at the meetings of the various sections of the congress, and by the American Public Health association, including the important question of milk purity. The exhibition will feature many factors of the subject.

The international congress meets once every five years. In the sixty years of its existence it will meet in America for the first time. The congress has the distinction of John Redmond, the Irish leader. Mr. Redmond is due to arrive in
