LONE HAND PLAYED  
BY NOVA SCOTIANS

Dr. Spangler Urges More  
Work Towards Ideal—New  
Governor Elected.

YARMOUTH, N. S., April 29.—A. M. Belding of the Saint John Telegraph-Journal today urged in an address before the Rotarian convention here the Maritimes to act together in presenting their cause to the Dominion government.

Mr. Belding's subject was "Canada, East and West," and he was introduced by Governor Baker. He showed that there was a real work for the

## REVIEWERS PROGRESS.

Rotarian Belding in opening reviewed the progress of the Dominion from the days of Confederation all down through the years until the Great War had come and gone. He was after that the depression was felt and it was then our people realized that they must take stock.

The Maritime Provinces discovered that they were getting the worst of the bargain, that there were problems and that the machinery of Confederation was not of the best for this section of the Dominion.

## TELLS OF WESTERN TRIP.

Mr. Belding told of his trip across Canada to the Pacific Coast and of the conditions as he had found them. He had thought as he started on that trip it was only the Maritimes which had their troubles, but as he progressed he found that the West also had similar difficulties to face. He also discovered that both the East and West had gone behind while the central provinces had prospered.

He had spoken in many cities and towns and men had asked regarding the conditions of the Maritimes and they had also asked as to what is to be done? That question is a difficult one for any person to answer, for it has never yet been known of any body of men meeting together to thrash the matter out.

## N. S. ACTING ALONE.

The Nova Scotia Government, said Mr. Belding, is now acting but is New Brunswick or Prince Edward Island being considered?

"For us to succeed in our object we must forget that spirit of self and get together and present the cause to the Federal Government as coming from the Maritimes united and not from one province alone," he said.

Following that Mr. Belding spoke to the subject from many angles and as he concluded he very pointedly told the convention just where in the Rotary Clubs of Canada could get together and on a common level bring about conditions that would make this entire Dominion prosperous.

## APPEALS FOR SUPPORT.

He appealed to the Rotarians of the Maritime Provinces to make their influence felt in the best interests of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

## SPANGLER WANTS ACTION.

Ex-Governor Spangler followed Mr. Belding in a brief review of the work being done by the Canadian advisory board which he stated was organized to carry on along the lines of the previous speaker had dwelt upon. The ex-governor urged that the Maritime members of the board come more prominently to the front and in the future make themselves heard for "if we want anything we have surely got to work for it."
