Q. 12. What are the further Regulations of Conference?

A. (1) That the Conference earnestly desire the Stations to conform to Rule, in recording their Connexional property. Forms to be filled up for this necessary purpose may be had at the Book Room; and they will be sent by Book parcels.

(2.) That we record our gratitude to God for an increase of 439 Members, 15 Local Preachers; 19 Class Leaders; 3 Chapels and 11 other places; 7 Sunday Schools; 71 Teachers; and 557 Scholars,

for the year.

(3.) That this Conference especially calls the attention of each Superintendent on a Station to extend the circulation of our Connexional paper, encouraged as we are by the success and usefulness with which it has been attended during the past_year. (4.) That the Representation from each District to the ensuing Conference shall be four Minister Delegates and eight Laymen.
