

Minneapolis, Dec. 24.-Pestilence threatens to add its horrors to those threatens to add its horrors to those of the forest fires that swept Beaudets and Sponer, and anuffed out thirty-two lives last October. Two thousand fire refugees, huddled together in bar-racks in those towns, and fed by the Red Cross Society, are in danger of smallpox contagion, introduced into the country by lumberiacks from Michigan, where the disease has been raging. Upwards of twenty cases are reported at International Falls. There is scarcely a town in Northern Minne-sota without at least one case.
