Q. 1 Your name is?

A 1 7683963 C.S.M. S.D. Drummond Crombie.

Q 2 Your occupation is?

A 2 C.S.M. of Military Police 157 Provost Company

Q 3. Where are you stationed?

A 3. At Brighton Sir.

Q 4. Do you know Lieut. C.W. Knox?

A 4. Yes Sir.

Q 5. Do you recognize Lieut. C.W. Knox?

A 5. Yes Sir.

Q 6. Have you seen him before?

A 6. Yes Sir.

Q 7. Will you relate the circumstances at the time you saw Lieut. C.W. Knox?

A 7. At about 1.30 hrs on the 4th Sep 42 I received a telephone message from P.C. 77 Baker, of the Brighton Police telling me he had detained Lieut. C.W. Knox.

Q 8. Do you know the Regiment Lieut. Knox belonged too?

A 8. Yes Sir, the 2nd Cdn Field Regiment.

Q 9. How do you know?

A 9. From the D.A.P.M.

C.S.M. continued with his statement: P.C. Baker conveyed Lt. Knox to the Military Police H.Q. at 19 Old Stein St, Brighton and at 1.40 on 4 Sep 42 I saw Lieut. Knox at this H.Q. and informed him that I had received instructions from the D.A.P.M. to detain him as he had broken arrest on the evening of 3 Sep 42. He replied, "That is right, I have just had a Court-Martial and I'll get another one. Anyway, it's a lot of fun." I detained the Officer at this H.Q. and ~~him~~ informed his Unit to arrange for an escort. At 0415 hrs Lieut. A. Maw of the 2nd Cdn Field Regiment arrived and I handed Lieut. C.W. Knox over to him.

Q 10. Do you know anything about Ford V8 No CM 4202187?

A 10. At about 2215 hrs Sir, information was received that the vehicle was found unattended and not immobilized in Elder Place, Brighton.

Q 11. Did you see the vehicle?

A 11. Yes Sir, I did.

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
