Competition at Plans for its Establishment **Now Completed**

> Largest War Ships Able to Pass to Baltic.

BERLIN, Feb. 11.-Plans for the new great naval base of the German empire at the western end of the Kaiser Wilhelm canal, at Bruensbuttel, have been finished and work will be begun immediately. The total cost will be in the neighborhood of 30,000,000 marks (\$7,500,000)

When the work has been finally completed, which will require many years, it will be the greatest naval base on the North Sea. The new base will rank with Kiel, with its great natural harbor at the northeast end of the canal on the Baltic. As long ago as 1908 the improvement of the small harbor of Bruensbuttel was planned; but the matter was not made public. At the time an appropriation of only 250,000 marks (\$62,500) was made for the preliminary work.
