### DERRIANA; HISTORY OF THE SIEGE OF LONDONDERRY, AND DEFEAT OF ENRIKILLEN.

Two days after the arrival of the French forces in Kinsale, Sir Thomas Southwell and his brother, and a considerable number of other Protestants, were brought to trial in Galway, before Judge Martin.
